

Spring Newsletter 2022

Welcome to the first Morris Vehicles Association Newsletter of 2022. It is pleasing to be able to report in a more positive vein now that Covid restrictions have eased and there seems a realistic prospect of scheduled club events being able to take place. Please note the information included on the Morris Vehicles Association Rally which is planned for the weekend of the 24th-26th June at Kelmarsh Hall, Northamptonshire. While many clubs have separate arrangements for their own National Rallies on different dates, it is hoped that MVA clubs will have a presence at the event and encourage their members to attend. The rally is being hosted by the Morris Minor Owners Club. The Landcrab Owners' Club International will be holding its National Rally at the event.

With the upcoming Restoration Show scheduled for the 18th-20th March it seems an opportune time to update member clubs on some pressing items. Not all Morris Vehicle Association clubs attend the March show but hopefully it will be possible for individual club representatives to meet up during the three days of the show.

There have been a number of developments affecting the administration of clubs in general which are giving cause for concern and some of these are highlighted below. Rising costs both in terms of the price of paper and planned increases in postage are forcing some clubs to review budgets and revenue streams. Another issue highlighted by the Morris Register in their recent magazine relates to new regulations affecting the distribution of Club publications to European destinations. It would be interesting to have an exchange of views about the impact this is having in different EU countries and what if any changes clubs have implemented where magazines are still posted to European members.

Club Magazines Sent to Members in EU Countries

One of the benefits of the MVA is to be able to exchange information between clubs. I am grateful to the Morris register for the following information clarifying the situation regarding sending club magazines to EU countries:

The EU has mandated that effective January 1st 2022 an Import One Stop Shop import scheme (IOSS) must be implemented for all goods imported to the EU. This means that full customs declarations are required for all shipments, including magazines, from the UK to any EU country. A consequence of this is that the club would have to account for foreign VAT on magazines and prepare a monthly VAT return for each EU country.

Our printer has advised us that from February onwards the new rules must be followed. The printer advised that if we do nothing then there is a risk that:

- 1. Members may have to pay local VAT and import duty on the magazine.
- 2. Magazine delivery may be delayed whilst local customs carry out their checks
- 3. Magazines may be returned to the UK undelivered due to lacking customs documentation or non-acceptance of charges by the recipient.

The Last Morris Minor Saloon

The last Morris Minor saloon to leave the production line in November 1970 will feature prominently at the Practical Classics Restoration Show on the weekend of 18-20 March 2022. The car, which was returned to Cowley in 2020 in time for its 50th Anniversary following an extensive restoration and displayed as part of the Historic Vehicle Collection at BMW Mini, will be on the Morris Minor Owners Club stand. (Hall 5 Stand 830). Effectively this will be the first time that the restored car will be seen in public due to the fact that during successive lockdowns no visitors were permitted to view the vehicles on display at the Mini plant. Complete with a recent MOT the car will be driven to the show and promises to be one of the star exhibits at the event.


